

Clubhouse Attire

The Country Club at Castle Pines is where Colorado casual meets Country Club elegance. We have a diverse Membership with a broad range of age groups, tastes, and preferences. A major goal of the Club is to provide an environment that is welcoming and inclusive and encourages all Members, their families, and guests. We provide a range of social, gathering and dining choices for our members that recognize their diverse preferences. The Clubhouse Dress Code is designed to recognize this range of choices. Members are responsible for ensuring that Family Members, including children and Guests comply with the Dress Code.

Clubhouse Casual Areas

The Clubhouse casual areas include Chef's Corner, Blue Sky Dining, Bar, Men's and Ladies' Locker Rooms, the Amethyst Room, and the Terrace.

Acceptable Dress

- All attire acceptable on the Golf Course is permitted in the Clubhouse casual areas.
- Non-golf attire should be clean, pressed, and consistent with an upscale, casual, private Country Club environment. Men's shirts must have a collar.
- Denim defined as full-length denim jeans that are clean and pressed and contain no holes or fraying - is acceptable. Jeans should have a designer appearance consistent with an upscale, casual, private Country Club environment. Denim that is excessively baggy, faded and/or worn hanging below the waistline will not be permitted.
- Hats for men are to be removed while in the Clubhouse entry way and all indoor Clubhouse dining areas. **Exception:** Men's hats are permitted (bills facing forward) in the Men's Locker Room and any outside dining areas.
- Golf performance hoodies for men and women are acceptable from brands like Peter Millar, Greyson Clothiers, Straight Down, Travis Mathew, Holderness & Bourne, etc. Athletic, sweatshirt or casual wear hoodies are not allowed. Please refer to the Golf Dress Code for specific examples.

Unacceptable Dress

- Unacceptable Clubhouse attire includes tee shirts, short-shorts, excessively short skirts, or dresses, cargo pants or shorts, excessively baggy shorts or pants, sweatshirts, tops and/or bottoms made from common sweatshirt material, athletic, sweatshirt or casual wear hoodies, exercise attire, spandex, halter tops, tube tops, extreme cut away or crop tops, bare midriffs, and fishnet or see-through attire, beach or shower flip flops, cover-ups or bare feet.
- Not all Tennis and Racquet attire acceptable on the courts fits within the Clubhouse acceptable
 dress code. If you plan to dine or socialize in the Clubhouse areas, please change into attire
 that fits within Clubhouse acceptable dress. Otherwise, please plan to dine and socialize at the
 All-Seasons Village.

Exception: Private Member Events can at times dictate dress code at the discretion of Club Management.
